You've been working in the E&E industry for 27 years, in Malaysia, Singapore, China, India and Vietnam. How would you rate our E&E industry now?

As I began to understand the commercial part of it, the legal entity, while also looking at the

overall financial mechanism – I had the opportunity to learn different things from each of the countries I worked in.

What made you decide to come home?

Being away from my family was one of the biggest challenges. Also, rather than simply perusing my knowledge and skills outside of the country, I decided to come back and help our fellow Malaysians as the point is becoming rather critical where we need to strengthen our overall skill sets rather than being complacent about where we are right now.

It is going to be very sentimental for me because for the past 11 years I did not have a chance to celebrate Deepavali because in most of the countries apart from India, it's a normal working day. Now that I am back home I can spend more time with my family, relatives and my friends.
